From the President

It's now the end of August. The feathers are getting deep in the loft. Where is that bird that I was so excited about when it first left the nest? The lawn show is just four weeks away and I've got nothing to show.

Does this sound like your loft? I find that this can be the most frustrating time of the year. There are too many birds in the loft, but the young birds aren't mature enough to tell whether I want to keep them, show them, or get rid of them. What is a fellow to do?

Probably the most exciting thing about this time of the year is when you go into your loft one day and all of a sudden there is a beautiful helmet sitting there that didn't seem to be there yesterday. Where did that bird come from? Isn't that fun? Now you can get excited about giving the other guys a little competition at the shows.

It is important to keep your birds healthy this time of year. Going through the molt is very stressful. If you want to have a bird in good feather at the shows, you've got to make sure that they grow those feathers properly now. Be certain that they get some extra vitamins and minerals, and keep grit in front of them. I like to increase the oil seeds in my mix this time of year to aid in feather development. Baths are helpful too.

In our last bulletin there were two constitutional changes presented for you comment before we have an official vote. Please examine them and then vote when the ballot comes out.

I hope you have voted on the elections ballot. I must admit that I was disappointed to see that of our fourteen districts, there were directors nominated in only seven. I wondered if we were only half a club. If you are a

member of a district where no director was nominated, why don't you take a turn at being director? I have also wondered if there should be some consolidation of districts. In the past 12 years, the club membership has dropped from around 250 to about 80 members now. What is happening to our club? I personally think that we all need to do a better job of promoting the helmet and also encouraging helmet breeders not in the club to join. There are a lot more fun things that could be done, but we need people willing to step forward and help. I would be delighted to hear your comments on ways that we can improve the A. H. A. and get it back to what we enjoyed in the early 90's

Proposal #1 Hall of Fame Award

by Henry Ebbelaar, Dennis Bray & Leonard Petito.

January 17, 2004

Section 4, Sub-section D reads:

The Hall of Fame program may be amended at any time by a majority of the senior membership votes after compliance with the provisions of Section A through E of article V of the Constitution, except that under Section D only one news bulletin review is necessary.

Change to:

Section 4, Sub-section D

The Hall of Fame program shall be reviewed <u>periodically</u> by the Board of Directors who have the responsibility to set the points for the award. The points required shall be based on the intent to keep the award challenging but reachable and will not be <u>changed more</u> often <u>than</u> once every three years.

Proposal #2 Breeder of the Year Award

January 16, 2004

Section C, Awards Recognition, Sub-section 2 reads:

This annual award will go to the member selected by popular vote of the membership on the basis of: (a) AHA show record for the past year, (b) results of his or her breeding stock in other lofts, and (c) genetic improvement of the Helmet Pigeon.

Change to:

Section C, Awards Recognition, Sub-section 2

<u>**Provide**</u> the award solely on the total number of AHA Master Breeder points that a member acquires with young birds in the preceding year.

Or — This annual award will be provided based solely upon the total number of AHA Master Breeder points that a member acquires with young birds in the preceding year.


