District 5—Steve Petitto—Giving a lot of birds away, trying to get new members. Hopes to have a National Show in Florida in the near future.

District 7—Bob Bollinger—Doing well, good point shows. Working with District 12 & 14 to promote shows there.

District 2 – Henry Ebbelaar – Getting some new members. Not much action.

District 6—Bob Dunlap—Shows are down due to illness and layoffs. Louisville was a good show, as always.

District 1 – Leonard Patito– Getting some new members. Pageant may be moving.

District 8–Wayne Diviney–New members joining and showing. Shows are good with lots of good birds.

E. Vice Pres. – Mike Crawford – Eastern Sectional was good show. Have trophys for next year already.

W. Vice Pres.—Dennis Bray--Western Sectional was a good show. Getting some new members in the west.

Old business:

James asked all directors and members to send in some articles for the bulletin, and thanked Bob Bollinger for his work on the new NPA book. Band sales were discussed. We lost money on our 2003 bands. By reducing the order on 2004 bands, we will make a small profit. Band orders for 2005 bands will be cut another 300-3500 bands. There will be a minimum order of 25 bands, also bands must be ordered in increments of 5. Size of bands were discussed. Band size is now 7mm. These are a little smaller than the aluminum bands were. Birds need to be banded earlier and are tight on some birds when they mature. Motion was made by Dennis Bray and seconded by Bob Dunlap to increase the size of the bands to 8mm.

Update of the Constitution has not been done. Brian McCormick has volunteered to do this.

New business:

Some members are still having trouble getting birds on the airlines. James mentioned that there is a letter from Kevin Zollers that may help this if shown to the airlines. The letter can be gotten from the Hall of Fame Award. No Hall of Fame birds since 1994. Requirements were set too high.

A proposal will be submitted to change the constitution to revise the requirements. Breeder of the Year—recommended that this should be for young birds, based on points for the previous year. A proposal will be submitted to change the constitution. Motion to check on this by Dennis Bray, seconded by Mike Crawford.

Muff Helmet standard needs to have minimum number to be shown and a points schedule to be added. The remaining members of the original Muff committee will be reinstated to do this. Toni Patti, Harold Strawniack and Albert Flinn. Motion to adjourn by Hank Ebbelaar, seconded by Steve Petitto.

2004 Board of Directors Meeting

Minutes of 2003 meeting were read and approved.

Officers and committee reports:

NPA Book committee—Bob Bollinger—reported that information has been submitted, and a half page ad has been submitted and paid for. Bob also reported that the constitution update and web page update have not been done. Bob asked for priority on what needed to be done first.

District 5, Steve Petitto–Possible will have a national show in Florida in 2006

District 1, Kevin Heppner–Had a good show at the pageant. Getting some new members. Lots of interest in Helmets.

District 6, Bob Dunlap-Had some good shows, treasury is growing.

District 2, Hank Ebbelaar–Got one new member. Eastern Sectional was in District 2. Good show.

Western Vice President, Dennis Bray–Western Sectional will probably be in California next year. Canadian National will be in Western Canada next year. Members should try to support it.

District 8, James Jensen–Lot of interest in District 8. Good shows.

Old business:

Futurity-lots more birds this year.

Web site-Needs to be updated. What do we need to put on the web site?

Constitution Update-Bob needs help with getting it retyped. Will talk more about this at the general meeting.

Bands–We had a loss of \$45.90 on the 2003 bands. Motion to reduce the 2005 band order to 3500, with a minimum order of 25. Orders must be in increments of 5. Motion by Dennis Bray, seconded by Bob Dunlap.

New business:

Hall of Fame Birds—requirements are set too high. Proposal will be submitted to change this. Requires a constitution change. Breeder of the Year—Needs to be changed. Recommendation to change to Master Breeder Points won by Young Birds. Requires a constitutional change. Proposal will be submitted. Master Breeder Award was discussed. It was recommended to change to recognize Master Breeders who qualify more than once in a variety.

We need to buy more patches. Patch needs to be redesigned, now only has 3 varieties on it. National pins may be available in quantities of 25. Dennis Bray moved that the Secretary check on this; seconded by Hank Ebbelaar.

Motion to adjourn by Bob Dunlap, seconded by Dennis Bray.


