From the President

Here it is the middle of July. The breeding season is about over. If you are like me, you're trying to get just a couple of birds from certain pairs to finish the season. The feathers are starting to fly and I'm wondering why I've kept all those ugly young birds. They don't look like there is any potential at all right now, but I remember that there were a few that looked pretty good just coming out of the nest. That gives me hope.

I have surely found that with helmets, you need to let them go through a molt before you decide which birds to get rid of. With the molt coming on, it is particularly important to keep those young birds healthy and happy. Although it sometimes is difficult, I try to keep from over crowding them. I adjust their feed a little to give them more oil seed, in my case safflower, to help in feather development. I like to feed a 16% protein mix for good growth. All the helmets get vitamins regularly and I disinfect the water pans at least weekly. Baths are given at least weekly and once a month I put 1 tsp. of Ivomec sheep drench per gallon of water in the bath water. This controls parasites and worms. With good feed and proper care, the helmets should have a successful molt and will look their best at the shows.

Speaking of shows, we've seen show dates for the national and for district 8. It sure would be nice to hear from all you district directors and vice presidents with you show dates so that we can make plans for where to show this season.

I'd like to thank the Farnsworth for their first bulletin. I thought it was great. I know that there isn't too much going on this time of year, but in order for Todd and Cathy to put out a bulletin, they need articles or reports from



YOU. The bulletin is the way that we can keep in touch with each other and keep our interest up in the helmets. Please drop them a note.

With the end of breeding season upon us and s lot of surplus birds on hand, now is the time to share some good birds with folks who are interested in helmets. I have found that the fairs are a great way to expose the public to our breed. They are also a good place to sell a few birds. Who knows, maybe you'll make a lifetime friend by getting someone properly started. I met Steve Mitchell 43 years ago when I came to his house looking for helmets. We have been next door neighbors for thirteen years now. Friendship is a big part of what this hobby is all about.

Hope to see you at a show.

Proposal #1 Hall of Fame Award

by Henry Ebbelaar, Dennis Bray & Leonard Petito. January 17, 2004

Section 4, Sub-section D reads:

The Hall of Fame program may be amended at any time by a majority of the senior membership votes after compliance with the provisions of Section A through E of article V of the Constitution, except that under Section D only one news bulletin review is necessary.

Change to:

Section 4, Sub-section D

The Hall of Fame program shall be reviewed from time to time by the Board of Directors who have the responsibility to set the points for the award. The points required shall be based on the intent to keep the award challenging but reachable and will not be changed no more often that once every three years.

Proposal #2 Breeder of the Year Award by Robert Bollinger, Victor Cline & Mike Crawford. January 16, 2004

Section C, Awards Recognition, Sub-section 2 reads:

This annual award will go to the member selected by popular vote of the membership on the basis of: (a) AHA show record for the past year, (b) results of his or her breeding stock in other lofts, and (c) genetic improvement of the Helmet Pigeon.

Change to:

Section C, Awards Recognition, Sub-section 2

Prove the award solely on the total number of AHA Master Breeder points that a member acquires with young birds in the preceding year.

A Note from the Rookie

By the time you receive this letter we will have used all our helmet bands and will have split our helmet pairs up for the season.

This comes as GREAT news after the extremely challenging year Cathy and I had last year. We could not get a young bird to live more than two days after they hatched. I can't tell you how many club members were there for us with suggestions and helpful hints to try as well as their friendship and support. There were also many things we researched on the internet. All of the information we had gathered left us thinking the most likely possibility would be paratyphoid. We treated for paratyphoid using several different medications due to the fact that the last one didn't work. We then had lab tests done on 1-2 day old squabs to determine why we could not get a young bird to live more than a few days after hatching. To make a long and frustrating story as short and to the point as possible the lab results came back saying it was due to e-coli bacteria. As the adult birds would feed the young it would give the young birds a lethal dose of the bacteria although the mature birds were stronger and able to survive.

In order to solve this problem we went with a suggestion that a vet gave us. We started the birds on Amoxicillin. This was not only time consuming but also more expensive than a lot of other meds. We were only able to get the capsule form of amoxicillin locally so we had to open enough capsules for the days water ration. We used 10 - 250mg capsules per gallon of water each day for 10 consecutive days.

I'm sharing this story with you in hopes of helping you and possibly saving you time, money and frustration in the event something similar happens, you could get it under control much sooner than we did.

As I stated at the top of the page I really do feel like a rookie when it comes to pigeons (so much to learn and so many great people with so much knowledge). If you have a short story that might help me and others please don't hesitate to send it in so we can get it in YOUR next BULLETIN.


