As I begin my breeding season with my newly acquired S.F. breeders, I have three essentials for success. Feeders, planned program and patience. With my first breeding season over I hope to show the west still has top quality S.F. helmets as does the east coast breeders.

Here in District 2 we had our first 50 bird helmet show. It was a great show and all varieties of helmets looked good. Dennis Manning, Vic Eshpeter, Hank Ebbelaar, and myself attended this show. This show had the biggest turnout for M.F.P.H. in our District. Thanks to Manning for the help he has given the other breeders in P.H. It showed with some very good plain head helmets. Hank who has been breeding them since the 70's and Vic who has been working with them since the 80's. We had a great turnout in this variety.

Hank won best M.F. and S.F. Myself winning best P.H. All winning birds were reds. I have found with my P.H.'s they are better parents when it comes to parenting their own young.

Our next show will be Thanksgiving weekend. If all goes well we hope to see another 50 bird Helmet show. Our District is coming alive again and with all 3 varieties.
