We had fifty Helmets shown with five exhibitors. This show is turning into a very good SF Helmet meet. Four breeders of SF with twenty five entries. Two breeders of Plain Heads. Four breeders of Medium Face with ten birds entered. This show belonged to Myron Berger who won best SF with a sliver and went on to win Champion over-all Helmet and Reserve Champion of the show. Nice win for this breeder and a little rare SF Helmet.

Our next big show in District 2 was the Western Sectional held in Grants Pass, Oregon. The judge came to us from Eastern Canada. Gary Parsons. The show was well supported by other districts. This was Gary's first visit to the northwest to judge Helmets. It was the first time for any of us to meet him. He had never seen any of our Helmets before this show. Excitement was in the show room to have Gary begin judging. We started first with the SF. Hank Ebbelaar won Best of Breed with a red young cock. We then moved to PH. Dennis Manning winning Best of Breed with a red young cock. Finally the medium face judging was started, lots of interest and excitement. Who traveled the furthest to win champion Helmet? Breeders from Utah, California, Oregon, Washington – all were represented. The winner was an Oregon breeder who almost didn't show. Last minute, he spotted a very nice little red young hen. Jim Garus' helmet went on to win Best Helmet among the other varieties and First Reserve Champion of the whole show.

After the show we all said our goodbyes to the out of state showmen. The west coast breeders all met for dinner then drove to Jim Garus' home to spend the night. On arrival to Jim's we were invited to his loft for a quick look. Very nice set-up for his helmets! My first impression was I had never seen so much good breeding stock in any loft. After this treat, into the house we marched to find Jims wife removing a fresh baked cherry pie from her oven for all of us to enjoy. We sat up until midnight discussing our Helmets. Sunday morning, bright and early (7:00 am) we were back up and discussing which Helmet we saw in Jims loft and why we needed to take it or them home with us. Judy again impressed us fellas with a great breakfast; waffles, eggs and sausage. Jim, great little wife. We were all grateful. After breakfast finally to the loft we marched – each of us getting to take home with us some very good Helmets. Next year, keep an eye out for the Washington breeders, we are going to be winners!


