An overlook on Helmet breeds Thomas Hellmann, Germany

It's sometimes astonishing to see how a specific marking can be found in various types of pigeons. Though the marking in itself doesn't constitute anything new to the eyes of the viewer, you can easily tell if a particular combination catches on by the popularity of the respective breeds. One marking which is frequently found in tumblers in various breeds is the helmet marking - the well-known combination of the coloured skull cp and a coloured tail. Though nothing spectacular at first glance, there is some difficulty in breeding helmet-marked birds for you have to keep the white from spreading to the coloured areas of the bird. The typical helmet marking can be found in a wide variety of breeds, varying from the short-faced Hamburg Helmet from Germany to the muffed helmet types found in Eastern Europe to the Danish Tumbler with their elongated heads. Also, the helmet-marked variety of the Cologne Tumbler from Germany is well appreciated.

Old marking.....

For me it is always of particular interest to check old sources referring to a specific subject to be able to reconstruct its evolution. An author most often reports about the things he is used to seeing at the moment of his writing so it is absolutely logical that we can find differences to what we see today. With regard to the helmet marking however we have to admit that sometimes an author does not refer basically to the nun marking. Aldrovandi (1603), for example, reports helmet-marked birds with a white head, tail and flights but with a coloured body (i.e. he's much closer to a monk marking with his description) but simultaneously he talks about birds with a coloured head with a small bib that comes along with coloured flights and tail with the rest of the bird being white, which is basically the marking we call "nun" today. In fact, some authors share the opinion that the helmet marking is a reduced nun marking. Though this theory might come handy, I think that the origin of the coloured skull cap and the coloured tail has to be searched for elsewhere.

It is also quite interesting to study the way the marking is described and named in different countries. Most often there are references to caps and the likes. The German word for the marking is "Kalotte", taken from French "calotte" which describes the small circular cap worn by priests in Europe, quite similar to the Jewish kipa. In mathematics we find the word with a different meaning in "spherical calotte." In Dutch they compare the marking for the first time with a helmet, hence the name "Nederlandse Helmduif" for the Dutch Helmet and of course the same picture is used in England and the U.S.A. In Poland, the marking is described as "krymka" (little cap), returning to the cap image. In Russia however, the breeders refer to the marking as "monach", meaning "nun", probably alluding to the veil worn by some nuns.

The Hamburg Helmet is simply called "Kalotte" in German and it is absolutely correct to mention the breed in context with the local breeds from Hamburg/Germany. Without any doubt the breed was refined there

and many important breeders of the past came from Hamburg and contributed with their visions and diligence to the type of bird we see today. Their original breeding material came in the form of the medium-faced flying Helmets that still exist in Hamburg today and please the eye of the spectator with their particular flying style of quick turns in their air. When in the last century the breeders set out to shorten the beaks of different beaks, the Helmet was also caught in this movement. Locally, breeders refer to them simply as "Klotten", an abbreviation of the original name in the local dialect. To shorten the beaks of these birds, people used the Reinaugen among others and there's also the word that despite their bull eyes, some breeders crossed them also with African



Owls. In 1914 some fanciers started a specialised club for Helmets in Germany. Unfortunately, this organisation did not last long and soon disappeared. However, the vision of the past of the breed has turned into today's reality: a docile, small and elegant short-faced tumbler breed with a fully rounded head and the typical helmet marking. Contrary to the flying type, the short-faced Helmet comes mostly crested; the plainheaded birds are guite rare.

The American Helmet Of course, birds with helmet marking were also brought to the U.S.A. and have succeeded in acquiring a number of followers there. Helmets were among the first breeds to reach American shores, brought to the country by people emigrating from Europe. Helmets were shown as early as 1874 in a pigeon show in Boston, MA. One of the oldest strains of Helmets found in America was the strain of Mel Evans, whose grandfather had brought birds with him from his native country of Wales in 1870. Mel Evans himself served for a long time as president of the AHA, the American Helmet Association.

Even if the birds were of European descent, the American breeders have bred the birds towards a type commonly found in different tumbler breeds in the U.S.A.--one could speak of a "general trend". The Helmet in America has an upright station with a neck slightly arched to the back and a straight-set beak - a rough proximity to the look of an English Longface Clean Leg Tumbler can hardly be denied. This proximity is made visible

also by the prominent forehead found in the breed. It's noteworthy that in the U.S.A there is a medium-faced and a short-faced type for shows. These are broken up again in crested and plainheaded specimens, leading to four possible appearances of the breed in the show cage.

The popularity of the individual types is quite varying however and the largest entry numbers are normally achieved by the medium-faced crested variety.

The development of the short-faced Helmet in America did not start until after WWII. One of the key birds in the development of the short-faced Helmet was a crested Hamburg Helmet cock from the loft of the legendary German breeder Hans Kopenhgen imported to the country by the Heubel brothers in the 1950s. This cock contributed in more than one loft to the development of the short-faced Helmet in America.

Where colours are concerned, there is quite a variety found in America. Apart from the standard colours like black, dun, blue and silver, there are reds and yellows (both as recessive red/yellow and ash red/ash yellow) with their own classes in shows. In shows you can find also the class "A.O.E.C", (all other established colours) where you can find brown and khaki, indigo and even almond-coloured Helmets. Well, I have to admit that sometimes I don't see the points in some of these colours, because after all, the Helmet is mainly a white bird.

The Polish Helmet As a marking basically native to the northern part of Europe it is not astonishing at all

that there are breeds with helmet marking also in Poland. Poland is basically home to 2 breeds with this particular marking. On one side there is the Polish Helmet (Krymka Polska) with its longer beak and on the other side there is the Bialystok Helmet which were created upon the first breed. The particular thing about these breeds is the fact that both of them are muffed. When viewed from above, the muffs should be turning well rounded to the side to create the image of fully grown circular muffs. In a profile shot you can discern the hock feathers found in the breed.

When talking about the origin of the breed with fanciers in Poland you most often hear that the breed's ancestors were introduced from the east by means of trading caravans. Some Polish authors include the Polish Helmet in the group of breeds

brought about in the east of Poland. Despite the fact that most Krymkas come crested, there are some plainheaded birds. These are found mainly in the region around of the city Wloclawek located on the banks of the Vistula, which is why they are sometimes also called "Kujawska Krymka", named after the region. Other hotbeds of the Polish Helmet are located around Warsaw, Plock and Radom. The Polish Helmet is a rather robust breed and fairly uncomplicated in its handling. There are breeders in Poland who use them as feeders for their shortfaced tumblers. Contrary to the shorter-faced Bialystok Helmet, the length of the neck should make up a third of the entire height of the bird. Also, the properties of the head lean much more toward those of a long-faced tumbler like the Srebrniak of the German long-faced Tumbler: a narrow, elongated head with an egg-round arch is being bred for in Poland. Just like in all other breeds with helmet marking, the pearl eye is aspired in the Polish Helmet, reddish or yellowish tints of the eye are downgraded in shows. Where colours are concerned, the Polish Helmet can offer black, red, yellow, dun, blue and brown. In the 1970s some eggs of Polish Helmets came to Great Britain, brought to the country by a former Polish resident. Ever since, there has been a small colony of Polish Helmets in Great Britain.





An overlook on Helmet breeds - (conclusion)

The Bialystok Helmet This is an offshoot off the Polish Helmets that could be seen also abroad in Poland in the last few years. Just like its ancestor, the Bialystok Helmet is also muffed. The breed was created in the around the cities of Bialystok and Suwalki in north-eastern Poland. In this context it is important to know that the Polish breeders have always had a liking for short-faced breeds - entries from Poland in the club show of the International Club for Shortfaces are quite common. Breeds that were probably used to create the Bialystok Helmet were most likely the Ham-

marking with the other breeds but, being a Dutch breed, they should also show a horizontal back, just like the Old Dutch Turbit or a good Old Dutch Capuchine. From the historical point of view, they are related to the helmetmarked Cologne Tumbler of Germany or the flying version of Hamburg Helmet. Also, the Dutch Helmet was basically a flying breed. The vicinity of Amsterdam was a hotbed of the breed. Spruijt, in his book "De Tuimelaarrassen" (1935) reports about flying times between 3-5 hours. A good Dutch Helmet is to have a wide chest covering the wing butts on both sides; the

burg Helmet, the Reinaugen and perhaps also the Konigsberg Moorhead. Bialystok Helmets are quite interesting birds - their neck is arched backwards and their head with the shorter beak is quite attractive. All of this blended in with a docile behaviour and wide chest in the typical short-face type, make the breed quite appealing. So far I have seen mainly blacks, yellows and some reds shown in Poland; blues are rarely seen. I think that the Bialystok Helmet might have a future also abroad of Poland as a show breed - time will tell if they are here to last also on the international level.


Dutch Helmet The Dutch Helmet (or "Nederlandse Helmduif" as the breed is called in Dutch); reminds us of what the original type of Helmet was like. They share, of course, their

deep breast is to be prominent. Very typical of a tumbler are the characteristics of the head, the eyes always pearl-coloured, standing out from the coloured skull cap and surrounded by a fine eye cere. The profile should be evenly arched and the frontal should not be too strong. Breeders in the Netherlands always underline that a good Dutch Helmet must have both the correct type and ideal markings.

So far, the Dutch Helmet has made little appearance abroad from its homeland and it is somewhat sad to report that this charming breed seems to be declining in its popularity also in its country of origin.

There are, of course, additional breeds with the typical helmet marking. Two of them are the Cologne Tumbler and the Danish Tumbler. In Levi's "Encylcopedia of Pigeon Breeds" (1965) we find a picture of a helmetmarked Catalonian Tumbler, one of the many varieties of the breed that faced extinction. Another breed with the same marking was considered a "pigeon myth" for many years - the so called "Austrian Fisher Pigeon", a colour pigeon breed with helmet marking. Try your luck with one of these breeds, you might find Helmets not only pretty but also enjoyable.


